

## HOW TO: The Jogless Join

When working stripes in the round, there always seems to be a staircase step that occurs when you start the new color. To avoid this, you need to do what is called "The Jogless Join." This is one of those things that's easier to show, than to explain.

In the pictures below, the right needle is holding the last stitches of the new round of color. On the left needle, we have the first stitch of the first round of the new color. So in these pictures, our next stitch will begin the second round of the new color.

Grab the stitch below the first stitch of the first round of the new color:



Pick it up and put it on the left needle, next to the first stitch of the first round of the new color:



Knit together the picked-up stitch and the first stitch, and be on your way.
