

HOW TO: SSK

In the shop we get loads of knitting questions. That's what we are there for. But definitely the most asked question is how to do an SSK.

It means slip, slip, knit. Usually the abbreviations we use in knitting are very logical, but this particular abbreviation is not.

Here is a step by step explanation of how to do the ssk.



Slip, slip, knit works two stitches together into one, resulting in a left-slanting decrease. The SSK is the mirror of the k2tog.

First you slip 2 sts one at a time - knitwise - or as if to knit.

Next, insert tip of left needle in the front through both slipped stitches.

Wrap yarn around tip of right needle and then
2 knit these two stitches together.
